## Pre-university – A-Level and SAM

DISTED pioneered the offering of the South Australian Matriculation (SAM) and Cambridge A-Level programmes in Penang.

The college has been conducting the Cambridge A-Level programme for the past 15 years. DISTED conducts the A-Level in two modes. The unique one is the II-month intensive fast-track programme. Alternatively, students may opt for the I8month programme. The choice of subjects is wide and varied.

DISTED has a track record of 22 years conducting the SAM programme. Students explore and learn in groups, research and present their ideas, much like in university.

Cambridge A-Level Science, Arts and SAM students can complete their studies in II months, making it the most cost-effective centre for pre-university qualifications. Also, DISTED ranks among the best institutions that nurture pre-university worldclass achievers.

#### **Business programmes**

SPM students can take up a diploma programme and then articulate into the second year of the business degree or a pre-university programme for direct admission into degree programmes.

There are four high quality and well-recognised 3+0 Britain's Staffordshire University business degrees at DISTED – BA(Hons) Accounting and Finance, BA(Hons) Business Management, BA(Hons) International Business Management and BA(Hons) Marketing Management.

Students can complete their studies in Penang or transfer to Staffordshire for their final year. Delivery encompasses course work, examinations, projects and assignments.

Its accounting and finance specialisation is also accredited by the ACCA (UK) and the CPA Australia. All diploma courses in DISTED have articulation pathways into relevant courses in universities worldwide. They normally receive quite a high level of advanced standing, allowing students to gain a large number of credit exemption.

The DISTED Diploma in Business Studies is also readily accepted by many private colleges and universities in Malaysia, including open universities such as the Wawasan Open University.

In accounting, the college offers the world-renowned UK Certified Accounting Technician (CAT) and ACCA programmes – the best cost and time saving route offering credentials recognised worldwide.

## Hospitality and hotel operations

DISTED conducts the Certificate in Hotel Operations and Diploma in Hospitality Business Management.

The courses open doors to exciting and rewarding careers and allow students to continue to study for degree qualifications.

Students are required to have hands-on practical classes, in addition to industrial training in first-class hotels and hospitality establishments.

#### Psychology

The Bachelor of Psychology (Hons) programme is conducted in cooperation with HELP University College. Graduates from the HELP psychology programme are highly regarded and have gained acceptance in a large variety of employment fields. Big companies have found these graduates fit well into their business.

#### **Computer science and engineering**

The two Diplomas in Computer Science and Business Information Technology address both the hard technical aspects and softer application aspects of IT.

Progression is typical for approved diploma graduates under the Malaysia qualification framework. They may even be able to articulate into business degrees in many institutions.

Holders of the computer science and II diplomas can also choose to work while working for their degree studies with the Wawasan Open University, a sister tertiary institution of DISTED.

Plans are afoot to secure more 3+0 hybrid IT in business degree programmes later next year.

The Diploma in Electronics Engineering is open to both SPM science and arts students who wish to gain broad-based and practical-oriented engineering knowledge and skills.

Holders of the engineering diploma can transfer with advanced standing to complete an engineering degree at local or overseas universities.

DISTED takes pride in its scholarship schemes, which are open to bright and deserving students.

Selection is based on entry qualifications, social economic background, extracurricular contributions and personal character.

The scholarships are sponsored by the Wawasan Education Foundation, Yeap Chor Ee Charitable Trust and the college's internal funding. The DISTED honour scholarship scheme recognises diploma and degree students who excel in semester examinations and are active in student activities. Students can win the honour scholarships consecutively throughout their studies.

Those who excel in sports before or while at DISTED can be rewarded with the sports excellence scholarships.

DISTED is also a long-time contributor to The Star Education Fund.

The intake for pre-university studies, accountancy, business, hospitality, computer science and IT courses is on Jan 4, the psychology programme on Jan II and Feb I for engineering courses.

Forecast SPM or STPM examination results are accepted for provisional admission.

Those who enroll by Dec 2I will be given a RM300 tuition fee waiver.

DISTED is holding an Open Day on Dec 19 and 20 from IOam to 5pm.
